

## **Australian Catholic University Neighbourhood Policy**

### **1. Introduction**

Universities occupy a significant position in many communities; as generators of economic activity, as land developers, as neighbours, and as property owners.

For over 20 years the Australian Catholic University (ACU) has provided an educational institution at the Strathfield campus. Over this time the university has strengthened its presence in the community. Consequently, ACU Strathfield has a long standing commitment to effectively consult with its community on matters, issues and activities that may impact upon them.

The recent master planning process identified a number of opportunities for the University to contribute to the Strathfield community and complement the work of Council. ACU is committed to working with the community on all levels to address issues of concern. Active involvement is the key to creating and maintaining a strong relationship with the surrounding community.

### **2. Purpose**

To establish a neighbourhood policy to create and maintain a strong relationship with the surrounding community.

### **3. Relationship to Master Plan**

The Australian Catholic University Neighbourhood Policy will form part of ACU's Strategic Plan and will complement the Master Plan for ACU's Strathfield Campus.

### **4. Vision**

ACU Strathfield aims to contribute to the well being and development of the campus and the community in which it is located, in a way that is consistent with the goals and objectives of ACU's Strategic Plan and will respond when possible to the expectations of the surrounding community.

ACU's vision is: "to enrich people, communities and the environment by making original and creative connections across disciplinary, social and cultural boundaries".

### **5. Policy Scope**

ACU has responsibility towards a multitude of services and facilities, as well as managing the economic and social aspects of the university. In addition to operating efficiently, ACU has a responsibility to control the development of the university with regard to various interests and the surrounding community.

The Neighbourhood Policy will manage the interaction between ACU and other sections of the University community, and address and monitor the direct impact on the surrounding community.

### **6. Policy Objectives**

As part of this Neighbourhood Policy, the following guiding objectives apply:

- To value and respect all members of the community;
- To promote educational, academic and cultural values in the general community and foster recognition of the University as an academic, educational and general resource;
- To provide a rich cultural environment for staff and students, which is consciously spread into the local communities around the campus;
- To sustain a strong and visible commitment to the community;
- To build University linkages with public, private and community sector organisations;
- To identify opportunities for the University to contribute to the resources of the Strathfield community and complement the work of the Council.

## 7. Commitments, Goals and Actions

ACU neighbourhood policy addresses the following areas:

- Safety and security;
- Waste;
- External Relations;
- Social;
- Economic;
- Traffic and Transport; and
- Catchment

The following outlines the goals and actions of each of the key areas

ACU has also identified a number of opportunities for the University to foster its relationship with the community including access to university facilities, events, services and community activities.

It should be noted, while on campus, individuals are required to uphold the University's code of conduct.

## 8. Community Engagement

The University will focus its community engagement on activities where the communities themselves derive clear benefit from their engagement with the University.

The University is committed to engaging with the community through consultation that actively seeks the views of the community and utilising the knowledge gained to make well-informed decisions about major developments and strategic directions for the University, as well as developing mutual beneficial projects with the community.

## 9. Feedback

ACU needs to actively inform the community as to why decisions have been made, how community views have influenced the outcome and why certain views or ideas may or may not have been adopted. Informing the community should be undertaken as soon as possible after the final decision has been made.

## 10. Delegation

Overall responsibility for the application of this policy is held by AVC (Sydney), and this person responsible for ensuring compliance with this policy.

This policy will be subject to periodic review.
