We strongly protest the fact that someone can now take this away from us, destroying not only our views, but our peace and quiet.

How? (1) In the long term for our lifetime - turbine noise, & destruction of the landscape.

(2) In the short term; Heavy vehicle noise & destruction of already fragile roads. Add to this the noise of a rock crusher. At the site of the rock crusher, (as proposed), the Council road road gravel; we can hear the reversing beepers on the council vehicles.

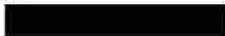
