Application 06_0135, Comberton Grange, Nowra. Proponent: Shaolin Temple Foundation (Australia) Ltd.

I trust you will overlook the slight lateness of this submission, given it's the holiday season. My principle concerns with Application 06_0135 are:

- This appears to be **<u>rural subdivision under cover of the tourism</u>** component
- The NSW Department of Planning document *South Coast Regional Strategy 2010* states "<u>no new towns or</u> <u>villages will be supported</u> unless compelling reasons are presented".
- Most of the proposed area **won't be local government ratable**, whilst <u>all</u> of it will generate impacts, environmental and physical, for which city ratepayers will have to pick up the bill.
- Employment generation for <u>local</u> people is highly questionable, since a large number of outside contractors and employees, and foreign nationals, are likely.
- High potential for <u>sedimentation and/or pollution of Currambene Ck</u>, the major feeder stream to Jervis Bay Marine Park (72% of the Jervis Bay catchment).
- The Comberton Grange land has been **offered for sale** to Shaolin (by Council) for a <u>fraction of it's true</u> <u>value</u>, and a pivotal basalt quarry potentially is sterilized as a future road maintenance resource.
- <u>Big bushfires historically pass through Comberton Grange</u>. This can be verified by the NSW Rural Fire Service. With future developed structures in place, this would be a massive drain on limited city rural fire protection resources.
- The site is also located <u>under the two nautical mile-wide helicopter flight corridor</u> from HMAS Albatross and the Jervis Bay training area (HMAS Creswell). Commonwealth Naval operations should not be compromised under any circumstance.
