From the submission and maps of areas to be serviced by the intermodal it appears that the M5, M7 and Hume Highway are expected to take a lot of the outward road traffic generated by the intermodals at Moorebank. The proposal identifies current unacceptable traffic congestion at the M5 / Moorebank Rd intersection, the M5 / Hume Hwy and some other intersections near the proposed intermodal development. It seems pointless to send trucks from a brand new logistics facility onto an already congested road network without doing something to fix the problems. As the intermodal is supposedly all about efficient logistics it is reasonable to assume that the intermodal operators should be concerned about the quality of experience they will offer their customers, the truck drivers, freight companies and receiving warehouses.

The SIMTA proposal suggests postponing the mitigation of these traffic problems for 18 years i.e., until 2031 when the intermodals are operating at full capacity. This is unacceptable.

As a pre-condition of approval it should be mandated that the M5 / Moorebank Rd intersection, the M5 / Hume Hwy intersection and the widening of Moorebank Avenue should be completed before the intermodal commences operation. The cost of the rail connection and of these particular road upgrades should be borne by the operators of the intermodal rather than taxpayers at large. Let the full cost of the intermodal be factored into the decision making.

The proposal for this site does not take into consideration heavy vehicle movements on Anzac Rd and Moorebank Avenue.

If the proponents of this plan believe that there will be no heavy vehicle movements through Wattle Grove then I believe you are sadly mistaken. The plan calls for all heavy vehicles to us Moorebank Ave as the access point and then entering or leaving the M5 at Moorebank Ave. Most truck drivers whether company or private will use the quickest and easiest access point. This will include access via Heathcote Rd exit from the M5 when traffic is at a standstill (which is more normal than not). If the vehicles exit via Heathcote Road then the only choices they will have is through Wattle Grove Drive and Anzac Ave. Anzac Ave due to its close vicinity to a large residential area is not a viable access road for this development. To stop the use of Wattle Grove Drive and Anzac Ave as an access point then either of the following needs to happen, the construction and maintenance of traffic slowing structures, the limiting of weight allowed on both Wattle Grove Drive and Anzac Rd (say 3.5t) construction of tight chicanes so as to deter large trucks from entering these roads. Moorebank ave needs to be drastically upgraded to allow for the movement and parking of heavy vehicles. Anzac should also be upgraded and narrowed so that heavy vehicles cannot use the road. No one in the Wattle Grove/Holsworthy area want these heavy vehicles using what is predominately a suburban access road, namely Anzac Rd.

I object to the SIMTA proposal on the grounds of

- There being no need for a private intermodal (additional to a government proposal)
- The impact on the local residential community
- The impact on regional traffic congestion
- The inappropriate selection of site for the proposed activity selected purely on land cost and not on site suitability
- The impact on our local environment & biodiversity

For brevity I expand on the last item only. In 2011 I was one of many to make submissions on the original proposal. Amongst my objections were:

- No consideration of the faunal component of the Endangered Ecological Communities has been made. In particular, the proposal will fragment populations of Bush Rat, Swamp Rat and Eastern Long-nosed Bandicoot which are amongst or possibly the last populations of these species in Cumberland Plain Woodland and Castlereagh Woodland EECs
- The impact on Priority Conservation Lands which would not be necessary if a more suitable site (such as that of the government proposal) were selected
- Failure to identify *Hibbertia* species on the site (refer p82 part 2), demonstrating a lack of expertise to identify threatened *Hibbertia* and other listed species
- Failure to consider altered vegetation composition and altered species composition (including loss of threatened flora) due to leachate from igneous base.
- Failure to provide concrete offsets or even demonstrate that suitable offsets are available for the proposed actions

It is highly concerning to note that not only are none of these shortcomings redressed by the revised EA, the items are not even *addressed*. How are the public to interpret this?

Since no response is given to community submissions I will not waste time repeating my former technical concerns. The present submission serves to repeat these concerns and to highlight the ongoing failure of the NSW planning system.

The proposal has failed to meet basic endangered species protection requirements or to even respond to such failures when highlighted. It should be refused by all relevant planning authorities on these grounds.

Content:

This is the submission of Cumberland Conservation Network in response to the draft Environmental Assessment prepared for the SIMTA Intermodal Freight Terminal proposal at Moorebank.

PREAMBLE

SIMTA epitomises all that has gone before, all that necessitated introduction of both State and Federal environmental protection legislation.

SIMTA imagines a money making scheme utilising an available site serviced by a rail spur from the East Hills Rail Line and thinks nothing or virtually nothing of constructing an additional rail spur which will impact on four TSC Act listed ecological communities and further fragment two of them. Two ecological communities are habitat for EPBC and NSW TSC Act listed flora species and foraging for TSC Act fauna species. In the process, a number of EPBC and TSC Act listed plants of Grevillea parviflora and Persoonia nutans will be destroyed while others will be isolated from their present colony. The only concession to environmental sensitivity proffered by SIMTA is the lowest level possible i.e. replanting of certain vegetation species and a nebulous management exercise.

The proponent persists with that mentality which perceives a piece of 'undeveloped land', as a 'gimme' for a new rail spur because it offers the least resistance in financial and logistic terms. This is the degraded state of humanity which puts pursuit of dollars at the highest level of human pursuit. It is the same degraded thinking which has necessitated introduction of regulatory measures such as the NSW TSC and Commonwealth EPBC Act to protect remnants of the nation's natural heritage. No more are such regulatory measures needed than in the most populated areas of the nation where a couple of centuries of intense vegetation clearing and fauna displacement has reduced certain species to "Presumed Extinct", "Critically Endangered", "Endangered" and "Vulnerable" status. SIMTA seeks to continue the onslaught.

QUESTION OF NEED

We beg to question what economic, environmental and logistic benefit derives for Sydney from the SIMTA proposal?

The adjoining site to SIMTA's proposed site is the focus of a Commonwealth Government initiative also designed to relocate truck freight movements from Port Botany. Two adjoining sites aiming to do the very same or similar function? The outworking of a combination of two like proposals will just turn Moorebank and its streets into the very same environmental and traffic nightmare Port Botany has become. This does not make sense because it is just transferring the problem from one suburb to another.

Is not each proposal just a matter of double handling goods? As we read it, goods are to be offloaded from ships onto trains, which transport goods to Moorebank where they are offloaded, temporarily stored in warehouses only to be loaded onto trucks for distribution to final destination. Additional handling arises because of the intervening train

connection and accompanying logistic issues. Compounding logistic and economic negatives is a delay for the owner of the goods between arrival of goods in Australia and eventual delivery due to the increased number of steps involved in movement of goods.

RAIL SPUR/CORRIDOR

It does not matter to the proponent and its ever willing and appropriately remunerated consultants that a rail spur already exists off the East Hills Rail Line and through Commonwealth land to the area proposed for the terminal. This spur, constructed some time ago, already fractures Castlereagh Scribbly Gum Woodland and Castlereagh Swamp Woodland yet the proponent seeks to more than double the effect with an additional rail spur making two smaller remnants, each less able to survive edge effects.

The more environmentally sensitive course is to use the existing rail spur and, if need be, create a route from the west which passes through the EIS identified exotic plant species after leaving the East Hills Rail Line. A points change could be constructed to link with the existing rail spur into the site. All this without widening the existing rail spur.

Adding to likely edge effects is, in the construction phase of the proponent's additional rail spur, trucks from far and wide carrying all manner of exotic seeds into the heart of the ecological communities. This situation grossly exceeds known edge effects from development on sites adjoining bushland - in this case it brings the threat directly into the heart of the ecological communities.

We suspect the existing rail spur was constructed before extant species were listed in the TSC and EPBC Act. Construction of the existing rail spur and other land clearing and development activities in and around Sydney in the past have necessitated the TSC and EPBC Act listing of ecological communities and species. It galls to observe the proponent not pursuing the fullest recourse to utilise the existing rail spur rather than impose a definitely worse threat that is an additional rail spur.

More galling is the proponent blithely dismissing suggestions to use the existing rail spur in lieu of an additional spur by lamely offering excuses such as warehouse site layout and potential exposure of Wattle Grove residents to operational noise through use of the existing spur.

In response to those excuses we assert:

i) Past use of the rail spur for freight movements by Defence Forces deemed it effective for the spur to access the central point of the site.

ii) Buildings were then located on either side of the centre line of the site.

iii) Commonsense dictates that the shortest distance from the rail spur to warehouses on site is the more economical and safest for internal goods movements viz., the least time goods are being moved the least the cost and least the safety risk.

iv) Central location of the rail spur is a continuation of goods transfer at the centre of the site to which Wattle Grove residents are accustomed.

v) Buildings constructed to the east of centre will serve as a noise buffer as well, if not better, for residents of Wattle Grove.

vi) Potential also exists for the proponent to construct a noise wall within the eastern boundary of the site as added noise abatement for residents of Wattle Grove.

Indeed, the draft Environmental Assessment is puzzlingly vague as to what is the future of the existing rail spur. This question needs to be opened for discussion.

Further uncertainty exists as to how wide the proposed new rail spur will be. We don't know the extent we are dealing with because of variable widths being mentioned but not defined as to what flora and fauna is impacted by a wider width. This is an unfair matter to have to respond to and should therefore negate the integrity of the EA.

FLORA & FAUNA SURVEYS

It is well known that the broadest seasonal conduct of flora & fauna surveys produces the greatest accuracy of species extant on a site. The proponent's consultant has undertaken the surveys in a narrow band of the late Autumn/mid Winter period. This is far from conducive to producing an accurate assessment of species inhabiting and foraging the site. NSW Database records are an incomplete guide and ought not be relied upon to fill the gap in knowledge created by a narrow frame of survey dates and lack of ground covered to 'ground truth'. It is therefore difficult to determine the full extent of TSC and EPBC Act listed species affected by the proposed activity.

THREATENED FLORA SPECIES

As indicated already, the proponent seeks to destroy a quantity of TSC and EPBC Act listed Grevillea parviflora and Persoonia nutans plants. An attempt at seed collection, propagation and planting as well as an exercise of plant translocation is offered as compensation. This is tokenism. It is not a genuine concern for the environment. The

Precautionary Principle should have precedence over the proponent's meagre consideration of environmental effect.

Both plant species are listed in Federal and State threatened species protection legislation and there is a consequential regulatory document - the Cumberland Plain Recovery Plan - which incorporates this site as the means to achieve recovery of these and other listed species. It is unacceptable for both the State and Commonwealth Government, which are signatories to the latter document, to endorse the removal of threatened plant species and introduction of threatening activities to their habitat, including reduction and isolation of habitat.

TSC Act listed Acacia pubescens has been recorded on site but this does not appear to be under the same threat from the proposal as other listed species.

THREATENED FAUNA SPECIES

Due to the seasonal constraint applicable to conduct of the flora & fauna survey we are left to express our doubt as to the accuracy of findings with respect to fauna inhabiting the site. Notwithstanding, four TSC listed avifauna were identified foraging on site. Potential exists for the site to be inhabited by more TSC and EPBC species than indicated and such species, some of which species would be more adversely impacted by the rail spur proposal e.g. should Meridolum corneovirens (Cumberland Land Snail) exist on site (though not picked up in the survey yet acknowledged as possibly being on site) an additional rail spur would seriously impact on present habitat and sustainability.

POSITION STATEMENT

Cumberland Conservation Network opposes the SIMTA proposal. The construction of a rail spur additional to the existing rail spur imposes a combination of destructive and threatening impacts on TSC listed ecological communities and species and EPBC Act listed species.

My name is Allan Corben and I oppose this proposal for one main reason being that <u>it's the wrong</u> <u>location</u>.

My employment background is 47 years in the Transport and Logistics Industry.

In this day and age you don't build this type of industrial facility in the middle of residential suburbs particularly when the business operates on a twenty four hours per day, seven days per week basis. It would appear that we haven't yet learnt from our historical mistakes. Developments of this nature should be built in areas of <u>no or little</u> residential content. Furthermore, the choosing of Moorebank as the most suitable site is somewhat questionable as of the total of containers landed at Port Botany only 13% are destined for South Western Sydney with 33% destined for Western Sydney which would suggest that Eastern Creek would be the most suitable location for the Intermodals.

As the NSW Premier stated "He could understand the Intermodals being at Moorebank if in fact Moorebank was on the genuine outskirts of Sydney". Moorebank may have been on the outskirts of Sydney 20 – 30 years ago but is now a heavily populated residential area. There are tens of thousands of people living in the suburbs that surround the proposed sites, with 39,000 of those within a radius of 2 kilometres of the sites and 135,000 within a radius of 5 kilometres.

I personally have great concern as to the impact that diesel pollution will have on the health of the residents particularly since diesel pollution has been placed in the same category as asbestos which is a know killer. In my street alone there are 8 young children who will be exposed to what can only be termed as a major health risk. I also have concerns at the massive increase in traffic congestion.

SIMTA have failed to comply with the Governor Generals Requirements in the area of cumulative impacts due to them basing their studies on 1 million containers when it is well known that with the Moorebank Intermodal Companies facility in operation this figure is projected to be near 3 million containers. If they have based all their studies on 1 million containers it would suggest that the studies are incorrect. There is a massive difference between 1 million and 3 million containers when you consider, (a) The health impact could be increased three fold and, (b) 2600 trucks per day versus a possible 7000 + trucks with both facilities operating could triple the level of diesel emissions not to mention the massive impact 7000 + trucks would have on the on the local road network which the communities own traffic management study has shown is currently at its peak. The studies must be based on the worst case scenario, not the minimum.

I have declined to include a submission on the SIMTA traffic studies due to the existence of an independent traffic model carried out by Traffic Modelling Pty Ltd on behalf of our community which

totally disputes the findings of the proponent. I believe NSW Planning was provided with a copy this document.

I'm of the opinion that the construction staging has been set in such a manner to act as a backup should the MIC proposal be approved. IE, Should SIMTA be forced to operate on 50% of the planning number of 1 million containers further development may not be required and the planned buffer zone warehouses may never materialize.

There is some question as to validity to the outcome of the air quality studies. To my understanding the majority of data was obtained from the EPA Rose Street Liverpool facility. In mid-2013 I received advice that the Rose Street facility had been non-compliant back as far as 2006. If this is the case the data collected by the proponent would be incorrect and as such the studies should be done again. This issue needs to be urgently investigated. I also question why the studies referred to in the EIS are based on figures from 2009 which is 4 years ago. Figures should be based on 2013 data.

Upon reading the current EIS documentation it is obvious that many concerns have been addressed by massaging the wording of the documents. Our community has become accustomed to being less than comfortable with its dealings with this proponent.

Attached is a file of petitions containing 1700 + signature from people who oppose not only the SIMTA but also the Moorebank Intermodal Companies proposal.

All that the people of South Western Sydney expect is a fair go which we are yet to see.

Following are my comments on a number of statements contained within the EIS. The yellow filled font is copied from the EIS and the **Bold** font is my comment on that subject.

Executive Summary

The SIMTA proposal has been assessed based on the forecast demand for one million TEU, within Sydney's West and South-West subregions. The proposal by the Moorebank Intermodal Company Limited (MICL) Proposal (formerly known as the Moorebank Project Office (MPO) proposal on the adjacent Commonwealth owned land would service the same catchment area, meaning that should the proposal obtain approval and commence operation of an intermodal terminal, it would reduce the ability for the SIMTA site to achieve full operational capacity. The cumulative impact of the SIMTA

proposal and a future MICL proposal would be substantially the same and accordingly, the cumulative impacts have been fully assessed within this proposal.

To build a facility capable of handling 1 million containers and then be prepared to only operate with 50% or less of that figure certainly isn't a good business plan and is definitely questionable and I'm of the opinion that this statement has been created to justify their proposal and to simply hide the facts.

Air Quality – the Air Quality Impact Assessment concludes that the SIMTA proposal will not exceed air quality criteria during construction or operation. The regional impacts of the SIMTA proposal are expected to result in a net reduction in emissions for NOx and PM.

I cannot accept this statement to be correct as the area of the proposed site is already heavily polluted and then to use SIMTA's figures they intend to bring into to the area 2600+ heavy vehicles per day and 21 diesel locomotives movements. The locomotives used on the metropolitan freight movements are very old and as such put out much higher levels of emissions. Most certainly the same applies to a large percentage of heavy vehicles.

2.1.1 REGIONAL CONTEXT

The Southern Sydney Freight Line (SSFL) is located one kilometre to the west of the proposed SIMTA site. The SSFL is a 36km dedicated freight line between Macarthur and Chullora. The SSFL commenced operations in January 2013 and aims to improve rail freight movements through Sydney to increase productivity and the overall competitiveness and reliability of the Interstate Rail Freight Network1.

As the dedicated Southern Freightline extends from Chullora to Macarthur I assume that the line from Botany to Chullora is still restricted by passenger train movements. Freight movements in the Sydney basin have always been restricted by passenger movements and as such have underperformed. Without a dedicated freight line from Botany to Macarthur the system will be a slow as ever let alone achieve the predicted 40% now 28% movement of containers by rail.

2.2 LOCAL CONTEXT

Nearby residential areas include Wattle Grove, Moorebank, Holsworthy and Casula, which are located to the east and north east. Wattle Grove is within the closest proximity, located approximately 400 metres east of the SIMTA site,

It interesting to note that SIMTA's previous claims that the nearest residential property was 1000 metres from their eastern boundary has been reduced to the more believable figure of 400 metres.

<u>2.5.1.3 WAREHOUSE AND DISTRIBUTION FACILITIE</u>Approximately 300,000m2 of warehouses with ancillary offices are proposed to be constructed to the east of the intermodal terminal. The proposed warehouses are to be sited and designed to provide a_physical barrier between the intermodal terminal

and the nearest residential properties to assist with mitigating the potential acoustic and visual impacts of the rail activities.

As the noise mitigation is dependent on the warehouse facilities to act as a noise buffer area for the western side of Wattle Grove it is unacceptable to operate the rail and container handling process's with virtually no protection for the residents of west Wattle Grove. The staging process shows that stage 1 is scheduled for completion mid 2015 with little in the way of warehousing. The next stage is not due for completion till mid 2019 resulting in the residents of West Wattle Grove being exposed to nuisance noise for a period of 4 years minimum. Warehousing in stage 2 is subject to market demand. This would suggest the warehouses that were intended to act as a buffer zone may not be built till 2022 if at all.

3.5.5 STATE INFRASTRUCTURE STRATEGY 2012-2032

The SIS recognises that there are two separate schemes being proposed at Moorebank, including a private sector (SIMTA) proposal and a Commonwealth Government (MICL) proposal. The SIS includes broad support of the intermodal concept, however, it recommends that State public funding for additional intermodal terminal capacity is minimised until there is greater clarity on whether the shorthaul rail market is viable.

This is an outrageous statement (Similar to the pink bats) let's try it and see what happens. The proponents and involved Government departments should already know if short hall rail market is viable. Having spent many years in rail transport I don't believe that what is proposed is viable without a dedicated rail line from Botany to Macarthur.

5.3.1.2 IMPACTS TO LOCAL AND REGIONAL ROAD NETWORKS

Regional impact from cumulative traffic - The modelling analysis suggests that the operation of SIMTA at Moorebank would have the potential to reduce the volumes of heavy vehicles movements along the M5 corridor by in the order of 2,735 movements per day. These heavy vehicle movements would be primarily redistributed to the west of M5/Moorebank interchange in Liverpool, part of South West and Industrial West of Sydney. Beyond the core area, where the SIMTA heavy vehicle volume increases, it is generally by a small margin. The additional truck activity generated by the SIMTA proposal would be concentrated on key arterial roads such as M5 Motorway, Hume Highway and M7 Motorway.

Although I accept that there will be a reduction in the heavy vehicle movements on the M5 (East bound) the figure will be nowhere near the 2,735 as not all containers will be destined for the South or Western Sydney. Containers will arrive at Moorebank that require delivery to the east of the Moorebank facility. IE Trucks will be heading east bound on the M5 to areas between Moorebank and the CBD. There is no way that Port Botany will load only containers destined for South and West of Moorebank. Port Botany has enough problems getting any train loaded without having to also sort them by destination. (We should not be misled by the spin doctors)

5.3.3.2 TRUCK MOVEMENTS

It is assumed that site maintenance activities will be carried out between 3.00am and 5.00am based on typical intermodal terminal operation. Consequently, traffic generation over these two hours is expected to be low.

This statement is of great concern. This form of maintenance can be extremely noisy without it being carried out at 3.00am in the morning.

6.3.1.2 NOISE AND VIBRATION IMPACTS

Isleep Disturbance – the transient noise events with the potential to cause sleep disturbance include rail shunting, horns, tonal reversing alarms and containers banging. The predicted levels at all receivers are less than the criteria and as such, no further assessment is required

I have lived on the western side of Wattle Grove for the past 16 years and find it difficult accepting the above due to the fact that I have never heard any form of noise coming from the current activity and can virtually hear a pin drop of a night in the area, yet I'm asked to accept that the impact at surrounding residences would be relatively low and all relevant criteria are likely to be met during operation of the facility. It needs to be remembered that the homes in this area are of a simple brick construction and many are within 400 metres of the proposed site. I find this statement outrageous as there is no way that the train horns, shunting operations, tonal reversing alarms and containers banging against each other <u>won't</u> cause sleep disturbance and will in fact continually wake nearby (400 metres) residents.

11.3.2 GREENHOUSE GAS IMPACT ASSESSMENT

Freight Transport Operations – the SIMTA proposal is anticipated to reduce the amount of road traffic within the local Moorebank area and the surrounding region, with an associated reduction in transport related emissions as a result of a modal shift to a more efficient rail transport. The net emissions reduction from freight transport arising from the SIMTA proposal has been estimated at 40,820 tCO2e, taking into account the use of rail transport, which is considered to be approximately 40 times more efficient than road transport.

My question is how did they arrived at this statement. There is no way that the proponents will reduce the amount of road traffic within the local Moorebank area and surrounding region. The efficiency of rail is yet to be seen.

17.3 SPECIALIST INTEREST GROUPS AND THE PUBLIC

The air quality and human health impacts were assessed by Pacific Environment Limited and Toxikos (refer to Appendix Q and Appendix W). The Air Quality Assessment did not identify any likely significant exceeded standards for air quality for the local community, however did identify an overall net positive impact on air quality at the regional level. The Health Impact Assessment assessed the cumulative health impacts and concluded the SIMTA proposal was unlikely to have acute or chronic direct health effect on the local residents

The people who are facing the increase in the level of pollution in their area (Liverpool) aren't one bit interested in the regional air quality. They are already concerned at the level of pollution in the local area without it increasing. What will simply happen is that the pollution will be relocated from a sea side environment (Good wind flow) to a location where pollution hangs with a poor wind flow.
