# Proposed Abalone Farm- Pindimar Environmental Assessment

## What is happening?

A *Project Application* has been lodged for a proposed development at No. 180 Clarke Street, South Pindimar. The proposal is for a land-based marine aquaculture farm. If approved, it will aim to produce around 60 tonnes per year of live abalone for human consumption, and is expected to employ up to 15 people during operation. The farm is proposed to be located approximately 300m west of dwelling-houses at South Pindimar.

The Project Application was lodged with the NSW Department of Planning & Infrastructure (DoPI) under the (transitional) Part 3A provisions of the *Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979.* DoPI is the approval authority for the proposal, and is responsible for its assessment and determination.

The applicant (Austasia Leefield Pty Ltd) has begun a comprehensive environmental assessment of the Project, guided by advice from DoPI and other government stakeholders. This assessment will ultimately inform an *Environmental Assessment* report, which will be lodged with DoPI to assist in making its determination. As part of this environmental assessment process, the applicant is seeking public feedback and input to ensure that all key issues and concerns are addressed.

City Plan Services, representing the applicant, is a planning consultancy coordinating the environmental assessment. City Plan Services invites local residents and interested members of the public to offer their thoughts about the proposal.

This is not the only time the public's opinions will be sought. There will be additional opportunities for community consultation after the Environmental Assessment report is lodged with DoPI.

#### Where can I find out about the proposal?

A *Location Plan* and an extract of the draft *Site Plan* of the proposed development is attached to this notice. You can find out more about the proposal by:

about the proposal and the environmental assessment process, and constructive feedback will be sought on key issues of concern.

- For longer submissions, it would be helpful if you provided a one page summary to clarify the key points you are making.
