Shane and I also intend to retire into this beautiful area. As Australian taxpayers and good citizens, we should be ensured the absolute right to continue to enjoy this quiet and beautiful environment of the Port Stephens area.

WE totally object this proposal for the development of an Abalone Farm. We have Marine Parks set in place in the area to protect our Marine Life, of which we totally support and abide by.
