RE: Application No. MP 10-0006, (Pindimar Abalone Project)

Dear Director.

We wish to lodge our strong objection to the proposed Abalone Factory for the following reasons

- 1. The factory intends to pump waste which will include chemical & pharmaceutical residue back into Port Stephens waterways, where there is no guarantee against spoilage of the bay's pristine area, which means both marine life & human activity will be under threat. Council would not be able to monitor this as they do human contamination, because the discharge will be 6 metres under the water surface. We have noted that up to 50 megalitres of this discharge per day will be pumped back, need we say more?
- 2. There is no suggestion of having separate access to the site, so this quiet pristine village will have the narrow access roadways (Clarke & Cambage streets) being used for commercial purposes. No footpaths are provided for the many Seniors & children who live here, so this could have disastrous consequences. Also they are not built for truck movements on a regular basis, so who is going to maintain them?
- 3. Noise pollution from the pumps 24 hours a day is an insult to the residents. Flooding in storms, a regular occurrence, in this very flat poorly drained area, with any leakage from the tanks added could also be a health hazard.

Surely this activity would be better suited to a remote Ocean access area where these concerns would be greatly diminished.

Please give the residents of this beautiful pristine area & the marine life an end to this unwelcome & unnecessary proposed Abalone Factory.
