I feel that the water's of port Stephens are a major tourist drawcard and make it one of the best locations to visit for nature, water sports and water activities, such as boating, dolphin watching and swimming.

I have read some of the details of the development planned and am appalled that your department would even so much as consider approving this highly invasive, and quite possibly damaging project.

Port Stephens is a Holiday destination for thousands of Australian and overseas tourists, who help generate \$460 million annually by utilising all the businesses that provide services to the Port. These are inclusive of businesses situated within catering, accommodation, liquor, transport, entertainment, aquaculture and maritime industries. Notably, all of these industries in-turn support local government administration. All of these businesses depend on clean port water which will obviously be affected by the introduction of the abalone farm.
