All this will be needed to construct 5 huge sheds, massive earthworks and waste which would be required to be taken off site.

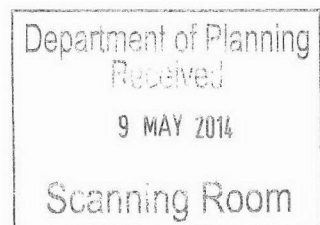
