CODE DESCRIPTION

A PALM GROVE

Currently under reconstruction to improve amenity including during events, more inviting facilities with improved safety.

B WESTERN DISTRIBUTOR OVERPASS
Major arterial road structure visually separating
harbourside precinct and Darling Walk precinct.

C DARLING WALK
Avenue palm trees provide strong visual connection linking to north of overpass.

(D) PLAYGROUND
Robust play equipment with shade canopy structure.
Well used in highly visiable location.

E LAKE
Large open water body with hire boat equipment for recreation/entertainment associated with Sega World interactive entertainment complex.

F PAPERBARK GROVE
Shaded seating area providing attractive backdrop to
Tumberlong Park, and respite from surrounding activites.

G LAKESIDE
Grass embankment providing relaxed waters edge
settings for sitting, relaxation, and viewing lake activities.

H) PAVEMENTS
Brick paving areas suitable for large numbers of visitors.
Clear, open circulation around Sega World complex.

LIVERPOOL/HARBOUR ST PEDESTRIAN OVERPASS Accessible pedestrian link to CBD.

J HARBOUR ST FRONTAGE
Narrow footpath abutting Sega World building facade and busy road. Inconsistent street tree planting either side of road. McDonalds 'Drive thru' signage visually dominant.

McDONALDS
Unattractive building undercroft area. Pocket park/lawn area appears as unprogrammed, left over space.

LIVERPOOL/BATHURST ST PEDESTRIAN OVERPASS Accessible pedestrian link to CBD.

LANDSCAPE ANALYSIS STATEMENT

The Site is located between the Chinese gardens, the Western Disributor overpass, Tumbalong Park and the Exhibition Centre.

The spatial character of the area around the Site is emphasized by a strong landscape framework of palms, paperbarks and lemon-scented gums. The palms and paperbarks within the Site form part of the landscape framework of these spaces.

Pheonix palms along Darling Walk play a particular role in defining the structural identity of the 'urban stream' axis extending from Chinatown to Darling Harbour. This avenue of palms is listed on the *City of Sydney SignificantTree Register*, 'Volume 3 Significant trees: other Government /Institutional Darling Harbour', Pages 198 and 199.
