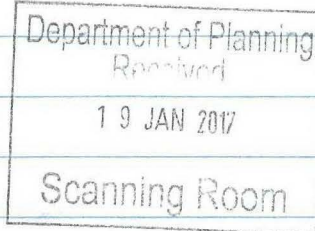

Dear Sir,

In 1990 I left The Blue Mountains and retired to Windsor Park on the shores of Little Lake. I was soon aware of the diversity of Australian plants and animals in the area at this time.

With the takeover of Morisset Peninsula by I.P.C. this diversity has soon diminished: the Osprey, mangrove heron, banded rail etc are never seen now.

The extent of the wetlands, inter-tidal flora & fauna and the loss of mangroves for shelter and development of fingerlings are evident around the waterways and wetlands; The delineation of the L.N.C.C. listed "green corridor" down the middle of the Bunnells Bay peninsula have all changed or vanished completely.

L.N.C.C. must accept the responsibility for this damage, including the proposed heliport intrusion to our local natural life. And this will take a long time, effort, and commitment, and cost, to repair. Better if it was not destroyed in the first place! And hopefully, L.N.C.C. will recognise that their members now do not have any real input into such a repair job AND have to accept that the well-being of our natural values is actually in the hands of developers - NOT L.N.C.C.
