As a user of the lake + one who appreciates the environment, I have already noticed great changes to our environment. Since clearing of the Trinity Pt. site, boat access to Bardens Bay is restricted. The Osprey and Sea Eagles that were always evident on boat trips are nowhere to be seen. The roosting Darters are no longer in the trees on the water's edge. The Pelicans are even becoming rarer to sight! All this + they haven't even cleared the trees from the water's edge yet to build their apartments + boardwalk.
