MP10_0229 MOD 5 LANDSCAPING – WOOLOOWARE BAY TOWN CENTRE AMENDED PLANS

We write in relation to the Further Response to Submissions for MP10_0229 MOD 5, submitted to the Department of Planning and Environment submitted on 1 August 2017.

Following submission of this package, Sutherland Shire Council ('Council') provided a response to the Department on 11 August 2017, requesting both additional time to review the submission as well as additional matters to be resolved with Capital Bluestone (the applicant). Capital Bluestone has subsequently met with Council to resolve the issues raised in this email. Council has expressed that these matters are now resolved and will provide formal correspondence to the Department when the revised plans are submitted.

The revised plans incorporate the comments made by Council and include the following minor changes:

- Revised playground design as a result of detailed design development.
- Location of Ausgrid crane pads shown.
- Updated riparian planting calculations.

As a result of the revised planting calculations, a final assessment against the DPI Guidelines for riparian corridors on waterfront land is provided at **Table 1** below.

The revised calculations above demonstrate that the final revised scheme will provide a superior ecological and social outcome to the previous use of the site, which was a bitumen and turfed car park. Specifically, the proposed scheme will:

- Provide a riparian corridor to Woolooware Bay, 68% of which is riparian planting in accordance with the DPI Guidelines.
- Provide 5,974m² of offset planting, which is in excess of the 3,449m² of non-riparian uses.
- Faciliate mangrove rehabilitation works to the benefit of Towra Point Aquatic Reserve.
- Provide an all-abilities playground for the use of all community members.
- Connect the existing cycleway between Sutherland and Homebush.
