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1 Project Overview

This Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP) has been prepared by Cardno (NSW/ACT) Pty Ltd on behalf of the Bridgehill Group (Bridgehill). The intent of the SEP is to identify the key project stakeholders and the strategy for engaging with these stakeholders to seek their inputs and feedback to inform the project.

The Tallawarra Lands mixed use development precinct is subject to Concept Approval MP09_0131 under Part 3A of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act). The site is located on the western side of Lake Illawarra, between Mount Brown to the north, Haywards Bay to the south and the Princes Motorway to the west at Yallah.

The Concept Approval was granted on 23 May 2013 by the Planning Assessment Commission for a mixed use development including residential, commercial, industrial and retail development, public open space areas, recreation, environmental management, conservation and riparian corridors. The Concept Approval has been reflected in the Wollongong Local Environmental Plan 2009 (LEP) mapping.

Bridgehill propose to amend the Concept Approval through a number of modifications under Section 75W of the EP&A Act. The modifications comprise:

- Section 75W Modification 1 extend the Concept Approval Lapse date from May 2018 May 2021. This modification has been prepared and submitted to the Department of Planning and Environment (DP&E) for assessment and determination.
- Section 75W Modification 2 undertake the amendments generally identified within the Secretaries Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEAR's) request (refer to Appendix A for the SEAR's request), which are primarily associated with minor expansions to the concept approved residential areas and an increase in development densities to raise the residential yield from 1,010 to 1,480 residential lots. A number of other administrative amendments are proposed to uncouple the Northern and Central Precincts from the Southern Precinct that Energy Australia is currently unwilling to sell. An Environmental Assessment will inform the modification.
- Prepare the First DA as required by the Concept Approval and subsequent residential development applications for Wollongong City Council (Council) assessment and determination once Modifications 1 and 2 are approved.
- Section 75W Modification 3 Lake Illawarra foreshore and Mount Brown improvements informed by an Environmental Assessment.

This SEP relates to all four approvals components of the project. The information gathered during the consultation process will be used to inform the design development and approvals documentation.

Note that Bridgehill have acquired land in the North Shore and Central precincts, to the north of Yallah Bay Road. Land to the south of Yallah Bay Road is being held in the ownership of Energy Australia. Consequently, the approvals documentation is heavily weighted to opportunities north of Yallah Bay Road. However, the scheme proposed would not jeopardise the Concept Approval south of Yallah Bay Road.

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2 Vision and Commitment

This SEP has been developed as the driver for open and honest communication with the community and stakeholders. The SEP identifies stakeholders, their key drivers and concerns and subsequent engagement and management strategies.

The information obtained during the SEP implementation would inform future design development and approvals documentation. The SEP would be a publicly available document accessed via the Bridgehill website. The requirements of the SEP would be incorporated into staff inductions and ongoing training by Bridgehill and associated contractors to ensure effective implemented throughout the design, approvals and construction phases of the project.

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3 Project Stakeholder Management

This SEP identifies the process to effectively engage stakeholders in project decisions and execution based on the analysis of their needs, interests and potential impact.

The purpose of the SEP is to enable a structured process based on the needs of the Tallawarra Lands project, to effectively and efficiently manage the myriad stakeholders. The output of this plan will be to develop a Project Stakeholder Register (Register) and the associated actions. The Register is the tool to capture stakeholder details and the engagement mechanism. The Register will be the primary engagement tool to manage stakeholders. The Register will be a live document held by Bridgehill that outlines specific stakeholder interests that may be required to be addressed.

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4 Stakeholder Management Processes

The four (4) core stakeholder management process and accompanying steps are identified below.

4.1 Identify Stakeholders

This is the process of identifying the people, groups or organisations that could impact or be impacted by a decision, activity or outcome of the project. It includes analyzing and documenting relevant information regarding their interests, involvement, interdependencies, influence and potential impact on project success.

The steps involved in this process are:

- 1. Identify potential stakeholders.
- 2. List assign / stakeholders into groups.
- 3. Define stakeholder key interests; potential influence and support level.
- 4. Rate stakeholder impact and support.

4.2 Plan Stakeholder Management

This is the process of planning for and developing appropriate management strategies to effectively engage stakeholders throughout the project life cycle. This will be based on the analysis of their needs, interests and potential impact on project.

The steps involved in this process are:

- 5. Develop strategies.
- 6. Develop action plans.
- 7. Assign responsible person(s).

4.3 Manage Stakeholder Management

The process of communicating and working with stakeholders to meet their needs and/or expectations, address issues as they occur, and foster appropriate stakeholder engagement in project activities throughout the project life cycle.

4.4 Control Stakeholder Engagement

This is the process of monitoring overall project stakeholder relationships and adjusting strategies and action plans for engaging stakeholders.
