Hi Lawren

The proponent has not addressed Crown Lands' previous comments at all.

Crown Lands will not accept transfer of freehold land from a development into the Crown estate, including Johnsons Spur conservation area and any other proposed land. References to this option <u>must be removed from</u> <u>all report and appendix texts and plans, including the Land Ownership Options Plan.</u>

Crown Lands has not provided approval of acceptance of land from this development into the Crown Estate The only approval provided was for the concept plan during the original SEARs process. This does not constitute agreement from Crown Lands to accept land into the Crown Estate.

Both core and non-core areas of this development, and adjoining developments, will increase the use of and maintenance requirements for a piece of Crown road adjoining the Illawarra Highway at the western end of North Macquarie Road. Crown Lands recommends that the road be transferred to Council. This will also need to be reflected in the proposal/modification documentation and will need to be addressed prior to works commencing.
