In response to the Director General's Environmental Assessment Requirements, issued by the Department of Planning concerning Illawarra International Health Precinct Huntley as a Part 3A project, La Vie Developments Pty Limited have consulted with the following Government agencies and there requirements are detailed and laid out below. The purpose of these consultations is to ensure that any and all of the objectives these agencies may have in relationship to this proposal are met.

This consultation process had actually started long before the issue of the Director General's Requirements.
