

UTS IS CREATING A NEW FUTURE FOR ITS KURING-GAI CAMPUS...

And now we are retaining a popular community amenity as well: the Gymnasium.



Over the past decade, the number of students applying to studying at the University's Kuring-gai Campus has steadily declined while applications for places at the City Campus have increased. In 2003, this disturbing trend led UTS to consider the available options for its Kuring-gai Campus and in 2007 the University sought to rezone the site at Lindfield on which its campus stands.

In June 2008, the NSW Minister for Planning approved the University's Kuring-gai campus rezoning application and concept plan.

UTS now seeks to amend the concept plan to comply with the conditions detailed in the Minister's approval and to retain the gymnasium the University previously sought to demolish.

In December 2009, the NSW Department of Planning will consider the University's proposed amendment which is outlined in the diagram opposite (retained gymnasium highlighted in red). If accepted, the amended UTS Kuring-gai Campus Concept Plan will include the gymnasium as it stands today and the local community will retain a popular amenity.
