## Consultations regarding site significance for the Aboriginal community

The investigations undertaken by Collins included consultation with the Local Aboriginal Land Councils. However, in order to ensure all possible interested parties were notified of the development proposal, further consultation was undertaken in 2008. This involved consultation with the Department of Environment & Climate Change (DECC) who nominated additional Land Councils outside the Hastings area for further consultation. These Land Councils were written to directly and provided additional time in which to respond. No responses were received.

Notification was also placed in two local newspapers – the Port Macquarie News, and the Camden Haven Courier. A copy of one of the advertisements is shown below. No responses were received from these advertisements.

Therefore, no additional parties registered their interest in the subject land, and no further consultation was required.
