#### Development for Gwandalan MP10\_0084

I refer to your letter dated 16 November 2010 seeking the NSW Rural Fire Service comments concerning bush fire protection for the above proposal.

The Service has assessed the application and considers the plans to be unsuitable to verify the advice within the application or to properly determine compliance with the requirements of 'Planning for Bush Fire Protection' (PBP). The following issues have however been identified based on the information provided;

- The RFS has determined that the vegetation to the west of the development site is classified as forest for the purposes of PBP, not woodland as provided within the bushfire threat assessment;
- The RFS has determined the effective slope to the west of the development site to be 0-5° downslope, not upslope as provided within the bushfire threat assessment;
- The RFS has determined the effective slope to the northeast along the northern boundary to be 0-5° downslope, not upslope as provided within the bushfire threat assessment;
- Road widths are required to comply with Table 4.1 of PBP;
- Vehicle access from Kanangra Drive to the south west part of the site is required;
- The proposed retirement Lots have a significant bush fire exposure to the west. The required asset protection zones (APZs) for future special fire protection purpose developments should be considered at this stage. The APZs for future developments shall be in accordance with Table A2.6 of PBP;
- The desired landscape character for the site is not compatible with a managed environment for bush fire protection. This is particularly significant given the surrounding vegetation.

Until additional information is provided and these issues addressed, the RFS is unable to comment further and can not support the proposal.
