Thank you for your letter dated 25 February 2011 outlining the concept plan for Black Hill, Tank Paddock and Stockrington. These properties are not located within a proclaimed Mine Subsidence District and are not subject to any building restrictions imposed by the Mine Subsidence Board.

Black Hill Subdivision: This property will be affected by current and future mining. As reported in Douglas Partners Report No 39664 future mining by the Abel Coal Colliery is proposed for the Black Hill property. Mine subsidence from the proposed workings would cause significant tilts and strains which would damage structures that exist on the surface of the property. Development on this property should be considered after mine subsidence has ceased.


Tank Paddock Conservation Area: The Board's records indicate that there are no recorded mine workings within Tank Paddock.

Stockrington Conservation Area: This property is undermined by old abandoned mine workings in the Borehole Seam. Extensive mining has taken place across the property at very shallow and deeper depths.

The Mine Subsidence Board recommends the controlled management of the following:

1. Eliminate and manage any risk of mine subsidence by suitable means to shallow mined workings and other areas affected by

Note: Mine workings may be charged with water. Water seepage may occur at seam outcrops and drifts. Applicant is required to advise Authorities and manage water emanating from mine workings.

2. This property is also within a current coal mine lease which is held by the Donaldson Colliery. Future mining may also affect the property.
