Our research on similarly sized developments has shown that delivery people often ignore the imposed curfews in order to get their goods delivered as quickly as possible allowing them to move on to the next store. More goods delivered equals more money.

4. The ruination of our village atmosphere. Erskineville as well as Newtown and Marrickville have a unique identity in a bustling city. It has an amazing village atmosphere which, in an inner-city suburb is quite rare. The reason for this wonderful atmosphere and sense of community is largely because of the small businesses, pubs, cafes and restaurants on Erskineville Road, King Street and Marrickville Road which create meeting places for the locals as well as outside visitors. A development such as AMP is wanting, will not fit into our village lifestyle.

5. We have as residents not been consulted, as claimed by AMP. We conducted a survey within our own apartment block (28 premises) and not one person had been consulted by Elton Consulting. I wish to convey my strongest opposition to plans by AMP Capital for the radical expansion of Marrickville Metro Shopping Centre.

The proposal by AMP is fundamentally flawed and will merely profit institutional investors by devastating capital and livelihood for the people of NSW.

Marrickville is known and treasured for it's local community feel, it's variety and diversity of character, the vibrant small businesses and small retail community. King St for instance, has a large number of independent designers. Marrickville and Illawarra Roads have family businesses, owned by real people - not just superannuation portfolios, without soul, connection or interest in the well being of customers, citizens or employees.

The location of AMP's proposed development absolutely cannot sustain the huge increases in road traffic that will result. Enmore Rd, Edgeware Rd, King St, Stanmore Rd, Liberty St, Angel St, Carillon St, etc. are already at choking point. AMP's proposals take no account of the severe impact this will have on local communities, to be grid-locked and boxed in as prisoners in their homes. To give an example, in peak hour it can already take 40 minutes to drive 5 kilometers from Metro to Central Station. At 5am on the weekend however, this is only a 5 to 10 minutes journey. What will be the result of thousands more cars on these same roads? This type of development should be limited to location such as Princess Highway, that have the surrounding infrastructure capacity to support it.

For residents nearby, already allocated just 7 hours of curfew on the Sydney Airport flight path, they would also be subject to the constant invasion of heavy noisy semi-trailers traffic at night. Street parking in the quiet surrounding streets would disappear, with more and more dumped trolleys, takeaway food packaging, empty beer bottles, etc. left in surrounding streets. Loitering, street drinking and other anti-social behaviour would be practically guaranteed to increase as the centre becomes a prime 'hang-out' location.

Community consultation by AMP has been appalling. Out of five of my immediate neighbours, not a single one of them have been approached for their opinion on this development.

Basically, there are hundreds of reasons why this would be extremely bad for Marrickville, the Inner West and the people of NSW.

I live in Lord Street Newtown, which is a one-way street from King Street to Edgeware Road, off which runs Smidmore Street on which the Marrickville Metro shopping centre is located. The residents here, over the years have made many attempts to try to cut down the traffic flow through this little street, which has become a busy 'rabbit run' in peakhours.

In recent years, the increased level of damage to vehicles parked on the street is just one indicator of traffic flow problems, as more trucks come through despite the sign limiting vehicle size at the King Street entrance and despite speed humps; it remains a thoroughfare where extra caution with trying to get in or out of a parked car is required due to the amount of traffic. Also the increase in density as cottages have been knocked down to be replaced with multiple townhouses (some without offstreet parking) has made parking harder. A big development in the neighbourhood could tip the balance at this stage.

This is just one concern in relation to likely effects of the proposed Marrickville Metro expansion which would certainly increase traffic and parking problems. I fear for what will happen if the proposed expansion goes ahead, given what can be witnessed in communities situated around similar developments (Bondi Junction is a good example of what can go wrong for citizens faced with big-business plans for a neighbourhood). Our neighbourhood is a special place, with its smaller scale development and a wonderful sense of community - aspects that make it a great place to live that could well disappear if such a large shopping complex goes ahead.

I appreciate that the nature of such locations can change over time but I think that communities need to be consulted about big moves like this and ours has been cut out of the loop by the developers bypassing local council planning. This leaves you as our representative in this matter and I urge you please to stand up for the community and its hopes for the local environment on this issue. Please be the voice of the community in this matter; if we allow the interests of big business to start dictating the character of our community we won't be a community, we'll be a collection of consumers. Connection starts and ends with community, not with consuming.

Please help us with this matter.

I have lived here since 2002, and because of the Enmore Theatre parking on certain nights was already difficult. However due to Enmore Road, sprouting more and more eating venues as well as night venues around the area, the parking situation has become a lot worse. I recently got booked for parking outside the medical practice, as there was nowhere else to park, parking spots having been taken by non residents.

I am a 53 year old woman who on cetain nights of the week get home quite late and I need to park near my unit for safety reasons. I also have to lug groceries up to my unit on a regular basis, and to have to park blocks away and carry them all the way down the street is extremely frustrating and tiring. I have been a longstanding resident of the inner west of Sydney since 1982. I moved to Newtown in 1993 and became a home owner in 1995.

I vehemently oppose this proposal because:

1) Marrickville, Newtown and surrounding local villages are vibrant bustling precincts composed of vibrant, creative, diverse, environmentally friendly communities who on the whole support their local merchants/shop owners and businesses. I have remained proud of the fact that this local area does not have or need a mega shopping complex. This may set us apart from other communities but I am proud of it nonetheless. I am opposed to the overall intrusion this massive overdevelopment would cause to the local residents way of life and the negative environmental impact (noise, pollution, traffic) this would have on the immediate local area.

3) Marrickville Metro is currently situated in the middle of a high dense residential area. The constraints of traffic flow and the impact this causes is already considerable. This enormous expansion/redevelopment would be a complete intrusion on the local residents and this is a completely hostile plan. I do not believe there has been anywhere near enough consideration or planning around the concerns of residents or the concerns people have about the increase in traffic on the existing surrounding streets. Where does AMP expect that residents will park their cars?

4) Residents can travel to surrounding mega shopping precincts such as Broadway, City, Leichhardt or Burwood if they require. I personally and strongly believe there are already far too many of these mega shopping complexes in Sydney and we should be scaling things down rather than ramping things up.

5) I believe that AMP has been derelict in their duty. They have not adequately or fully consulted with the local and wider community. They have not been truthful about the extent of this development and they have not discussed the impact of increased traffic or the environmental constraints this would cause. The information in the petition they have put around the Metro is disingenuous and quite untrue. Much of the local community has not had an opportunity to ask them questions and this should have been canvassed and addressed before any such proposal was put forward. Much of the local community would have no idea about the extent of this proposal or the negative impact this will have on them or their neighbours. The proposal is an abuse of AMP?s money, power and greed.
6) The residents who live nearer to the existing Metro already endure the enormous congestion and extra traffic on weekends. This would increase enormously if this proposal proceeds. I can only imagine the horrific circumstances we would be expected to endure if we allow an extra 4 million shoppers per year to flow into this community. I can only imagine how it would feel if my house was overshadowed by a high rise shopping complex and mega parking station.

7) Has AMP forgotten that this is a residential area? Yes, I am just a small part of a very large community but I know that many of us choose and share a way of life which does not embrace or support the ideology behind mega shopping complex or major shopping chains. I like many other like minded individuals don?t support this ideology which encourages an ever expanding excess in an already overly indulgent consuming way of life. This proposal will set the pace for the beginning of the end to our alternate, environmentally friendly and responsible way of life.
8) Local businesses in the metro may be ?hoodwinked? in their belief that their profits will flow as a result of this

redevelopment. No, their rents will increase, the local sentiment of support will be lost and the vast majority of residents will never recover from such an abusive disrespectful way they have been treated. It will have an absolutely long lasting negative impact on our local environment and it will completely disrupt the fabric of our local community.

Charmaine,

Thanks yet again for your e mail.

As I have said repeatedly now I do not share your views on the issue.

You have however made certain allegations of corruption that I suggest you lodge with the ICAC if you seriously believe this to be the case.

In terms of council deciding to make an allocation of funds for the campaign to prevent the expansion and your assertion that its just 32 residents who oppose it. I assert that you are once again wrong. It is well above 32 residents who oppose the proposal, as well as all small business operators in our LGA.

The residents around the Metro are the most affected residents. Even if it were 1 resident objecting and those objections are legitimate then those concerns are legitimate. To date only 1 person (you) has contacted me in Favor of the further development of the Metro site, I have at least 50 resident submissions opposing it. None of those residents have expressed concern about Metro in terms of the swimming pool. They all object to increasing the amount of traffic in their streets (and other problems).

In terms of referring to lifestyle choices – I was talking specifically about your submission for convenient shopping outweighing the permanent effect the development will have on residents living around the development.

You can check whether I was at the meeting or not by calling the council, so its not a moot point. The newspapers get it wrong all the time.

Council is entitled to commission reports and it has done so via allowing the mainstreet committee to give \$3000 to the Chamber of commerce. The funding for the mainstreet committee is 50% Commercially zoned properties and 50% council funds. The purpose of the Mainstreet committee is to support the small shopping strips. The report being commissioned to assess the impact of the Metro on small businesses. The aims of the Chamber and of the mainstreet committee on this issue are identical – it doesn't matter whether the mainstreet committee or the Chamber carry out the report from a representational point of view.

The Metro expansion is not permissible when considering the planning laws that exist, why should AMP be exempted from the planning laws. No other person, company, corporation or business can get a rezoning on those lands – why should they be allowed to? Are they special? There are commercially zoned areas, commerce belongs in those zones. Metro is bigger than it should be, there is inadequate infrastructure in terms of roads to that area, expanding it will make things worse. When talking about being Fair minded and giving all of us a fair go I am very clearly referring to the fact that Metro and AMP are being given a massive financial advantage by not being expected to comply with the rules that exist

for everyone else.

Finally spare me your indignation, you wrote to me making an allegation that I was behaving in a corrupt manner (amongst others), yes I find such assertions ridiculous and quite offensive.

In summary I do not agree with your views that shopping convenience of some comes before:

- the well being or residents who live around metro
- The shopkeepers and shop owners of the Marrickville LGA
- The right that we are all afforded the same advantages in life
- That for shopping convenience we create a new classification of land use that apply for everyone except the massive corporations of Westfields and AMP

I have no problems with strip shopping and yes I do support small business over massive franchises. As such I see no problem with council providing financial assistance to cash starved shopping strips, Metro has clearly got enough cash to influence government policy on this issue – I have no problems denying them a further \$3000.

Thank you yet again for your e mail, I have made a commitment that I will attempt to reply to all e mail and messages that I receive, I think however I have spend enough time on this strain of e mail, please excuse me if I no longer reply.

Thank you for your e mail although I do not share your views on this topic.

You may not be aware but the lands around the Marrickville Metro site were categorized category A industrial lands by the state government in its metro strategy a few years ago. This category was given to Industrial Lands that were considered so significant that they could not be rezoned for any other use except for Industrial use.

Commercial uses such as Marrickville Metro style retail is specifically prohibited in such zones. In the same document the government also announced that it would consider changing the zone from category A lands only if the interested party was the owners of Marrickville Metro. In essence what they were saying is that purchasers of these lands were not on a level playing field and that the owners of Marrickville Metro were being given a massive advantage in the purchase of these lands. This is the only site that I am aware of that is being treated in this way. Sound dodgy? It does to me.

I find it disgraceful that any government would categorize lands as type A industrial for everyone else except for a major corporation with heaps of cash. Obviously something isn't right here and smaller players are not being treated with the same equality as larger players.

In the election campaign 2 years ago, I ran on a platform that clearly stated that I would support small family businesses that are in existing commercial areas. I have also said repeatedly (prior to the last election) that I would in no way support an expansion of Marrickville Metro as it would be detrimental to small businesses in the area who have gone and purchased in existing retail areas and are now being placed in an unfair and grossly disadvantaged position commercially.

I too would like to be given the option of buying property knowing that the government would rezone the land that I purchase would be rezoned in a very favorable manner to me in a commercial sense. However the same advantage is not afforded to me or any other individual, company or corporation. I will not under any circumstance support an expansion which I believe is wrong, detrimental to the public interest and that stinks to high heaven.

I am writing to you today regarding your opposition to the Marrickville Metro expansion.

I read in the Inner West Courier today that council unanimously voted to give the Marrickville Chamber of Commerce \$10,000 to fight the expansion of this much needed shopping centre.

Marrickville Metro is the only shopping centre for some distance in this area. It is overcrowded, with not enough parking, simply because of the sheer numbers of people it has to service. People from Marrickville, Newtown, Erskineville, St Peters, Alexandria, Stanmore and Petersham all shop here. While the volume of people is an issue for most people who come here, most use this shopping centre simply because getting to your "local shopping strips" is worse.

The parking at these "strips" is negligible, and if you do happen to find one, the unappealing grubby facades and footpaths make it a horrible experience. Also, while these strips may be fine for people who live nearby, those of us who don't, or need to buy groceries for an entire family, need to drive their car.

It has not escaped my notice that several councillors at Marrickville own businesses at the Marrickville shopping strip, and one of these (who voted to give \$10,000 of ratepayers money) is the head of the Marrickville chamber of commerce. This is pretty typical of the self serving interests of the ALP and Independent councillors, This is certainly not the first time that they have voted to give themselves money, but I am pretty disappointed in the Greens.

At the last local elections, I received leaflets from many candidates. EVERY SINGLE ONE of them promised to "Clean up Marrickville". One councillor even stated that he drove down every street regularly. What a load of garbage. The park next door to my house has had broken and grafitied play equipment laying neglected for the better part of a year, there are massive potholes in every street surrounding me, there is constant illegal dumping in the lane ways and graffiti is absolutely out of control. There was some desultory effort to plant some trees to cover the graffiti along one wall, but the charming young men who occupy the park to smoke dope every night have simply vandalised them as well. The saddest part of all this is that I live a stones throw from the council depot.Its not like you have to travel far to fix things. The residents of this area need an expanded Metro, with adequate parking and public transport, what we don't need is a group of self serving small business people who cant think past their wallets and obviously do not care about the slum this area is becoming.

As you are no doubt aware, AMP Capital Investors, owner of Marrickville Metro Shopping Centre, has submitted plans to your department for the redevelopment of The Marrickville Metro Shopping Centre.

AMP proposes a 115% increase in gross floor area and a 65% increase in parking for Marrickville Metro. The plan includes prohibited development – expansion of retailing on the industrial zoned land.

There are more than 2000 residences within 600m radius of the centre of Marrickville Metro and over 11,000 residences within a 1 kilometre radius of the centre.

AMP Capital purports to be community focused and to have consulted with the local community. However, in reality AMP contacted 1200 residents over a period of two years, and the vast majority were not local residents. Furthermore, nobody consulted were shown AMP's plans to expand. The 1200 consulted were not given the opportunity to comment on the size and scale of the expansion. The majority of local residents who will be most negatively impacted by the development have not received contact from AMP until a 3rd newsletter dated August 2010, nor were they door-knocked or contacted by phone.

Phone polling was conducted at 2pm on a weekday related to shopping preference rather than consultation on impact of proposed development of the Metro shopping centre, about which no information was provided.

A community group opposing the expansion have communicated with more than 1500 local residents and almost all were under the misconception that Marrickville Metro Shopping Centre is undergoing a "revitalisation".

Residents assumed revitalisation meant modernising and renovating the current centre. Nobody realised the actual size and scale of the proposed expansion.

AMP's proposal for a shopping centre more than twice the size and height of the current Marrickville Metro is not in sympathy will the surrounding built environment (three sides of the existing centre are largely Federation and post-Federation cottages). Our single lane residential streets were never intended to cope with the current shopping centre, let alone one that is double in size and is projecting to attract approximately 5 million shoppers per year.

AMP's traffic study has identified that traffic will increase by a minimum of 50%. At peak times projected traffic increase is more. The report says that the surrounding roads are currently already at maximum capacity. Currently peak traffic brings surrounding streets to gridlock. The projected increase in traffic will seriously affect many streets in Newtown, Enmore, St Peters and Sydenham in addition to the streets around the Metro shopping centre.

Local Residents will experience a huge increase in trucks, cars, noise and air pollution affecting our quality of life, and small businesses along our vibrant inner west shopping strips will be ruined by the arrival of a giant shopping mall in the heart of our village. Our shopping strips are community spaces, and they are integral to the diversity and enjoyment of the suburb of Marrickville.

AMP has lodged a formal request with Marrickville Council to purchase Smidmore Street. In return it is offering "open green space for community enjoyment". Residents have never asked for this, we have open green spaces in our parks, including Enmore Park, located one block away. AMP's true intention is to link the current Metro site with the warehouse it purchased in Smidmore Street. AMP has no regard for how this will worsen the traffic situation. Members of the local community surveyed Smidmore Street on Saturday 31 July 2010.

The following number of vehicles used Smidmore Street in the duration of 3 hours: 11am-12 noon - 994 vehicles 12 noon-1pm - 1052 vehicles 1pm-2pm - 1003 vehicles

Losing Smidmore Street will increase the burden of traffic on surrounding streets, which if this proposal goes ahead, will increase by a minimum of 50%. Expanding Marrickville Metro shopping centre by an additional 35,505 square metres means:

- More than doubling current retail space and more than doubling the current building height
- 4 million extra shoppers each year
- · More cars and trucks clogging local roads
- More noise and air pollution
- Devastation of our local shopping villages and businesses
- · Parking problems for local residents
- · Privatised community space

Very few people in the Marrickville area are happy about this proposal now that we understand it's full scale. It has become a major issue that will decide votes in the upcoming state election in March.

I am urging you to save Marrickville from this unsuitable development and not allow this project to go ahead.

I'm writing with regards to AMP Capital's plans to expand the Metro shopping centre. I would like to strongly urge you to oppose this expansion. The roads around the metro are busy enough already - I used to live on Edgeware Rd, and eventually got sick of the noise from cars and trucks almost 24 hours a day. An expansion will only increase this traffic pollution, and the lack of frequent public transport in close proximity to the Metro means that cars will remain a priority for people shopping there. As you are no doubt aware, AMP Capital Investors, owner of Marrickville Metro Shopping Centre, has submitted plans to your department for the redevelopment of The Marrickville Metro Shopping Centre.

AMP proposes a 115% increase in gross floor area and a 65% increase in parking for Marrickville Metro. The plan includes prohibited development - expansion of retailing on the industrial zoned land.

There are more than 2000 residences within 600m radius of the centre of Marrickville Metro and over 11,000 residences within a 1 kilometre radius of the centre.

AMP Capital purports to be community focused and to have consulted with the local community. However, in reality AMP contacted 1200 residents over a period of two years, and the vast majority were not local residents. Furthermore, nobody consulted were shown AMP's plans to expand. The 1200 consulted were not given the opportunity to comment on the size and scale of the expansion. The majority of local residents who will be most negatively impacted by the development have not received contact from AMP until a 3rd newsletter dated August 2010, nor were they door-knocked or contacted by phone.

Phone polling was conducted at 2pm on a weekday related to shopping preference rather than consultation on impact of proposed development of the Metro shopping centre, about which no information was provided.

A community group opposing the expansion have communicated with more than 1500 local residents and almost all were under the misconception that Marrickville Metro Shopping Centre is undergoing a "revitalisation". Residents assumed revitalisation meant modernising and renovating the current centre. Nobody realised the actual size and scale of the proposed expansion.

AMP's proposal for a shopping centre more than twice the size and height of the current Marrickville Metro is not in sympathy will the surrounding built environment (three sides of the existing centre are largely Federation and post-Federation cottages). Our single lane residential streets were never intended to cope with the current shopping centre, let alone one that is double in size and is projecting to attract approximately 5 million shoppers per year.

AMP's traffic study has identified that traffic will increase by a minimum of 50%. At peak times projected traffic increase is more. The report says that the surrounding roads are currently already at maximum capacity. Currently peak traffic brings surrounding streets to gridlock. The projected increase in traffic will seriously affect many streets in Newtown, Enmore, St Peters and Sydenham in addition to the streets around the Metro shopping centre.

Local Residents will experience a huge increase in trucks, cars, noise and air pollution affecting our quality of life, and small businesses along our vibrant inner west shopping strips will be ruined by the arrival of a giant shopping mall in the heart of our village. Our shopping strips are community spaces, and they are integral to the diversity and enjoyment of the suburb of Marrickville.

AMP has lodged a formal request with Marrickville Council to purchase Smidmore Street. In return it is offering "open green space for community enjoyment". Residents have never asked for this, we have open green spaces in our parks, including Enmore Park, located one block away. AMP's true intention is to link the current Metro site with the warehouse it purchased in Smidmore Street. AMP has no regard for how this will worsen the traffic situation. Members of the local community surveyed Smidmore Street on Saturday 31 July 2010.

The following number of vehicles used Smidmore Street in the duration of 3 hours: 11am-12 noon - 994 vehicles 12 noon-1pm - 1052 vehicles 1pm-2pm - 1003 vehicles

Losing Smidmore Street will increase the burden of traffic on surrounding streets, which if this proposal goes ahead, will increase by a minimum of 50%. Expanding Marrickville Metro shopping centre by an additional 35,505 square metres means:

- More than doubling current retail space and more than doubling the current building height
- 4 million extra shoppers each year
- More cars and trucks clogging local roads
- More noise and air pollution
- Devastation of our local shopping villages and businesses
- Parking problems for local residents
- Privatised community space

Very few people in the Marrickville area are happy about this proposal now that we understand it's full scale. It has become a major issue that will decide votes in the upcoming state election in March.

I am urging you to save Marrickville from this unsuitable development and not allow this project to go ahead.

I am writing regarding the proposed redevelopment of The Marrickville Metro Shopping Centre to be considered by your department.

AMP proposes to more than double the floor area and substantially increase parking for Marrickville Metro. I also understand that the plan includes expansion of retailing on industrially zoned land, and that this is land that has previously been denied residential rezoning.

I live on Edgeware Road, Enmore, one of over 11,000 residences within a 1 kilometre radius of the centre.

I was surprised to learn that AMP Capital were claiming to have conducted extensive community consultation. I know of no-one who has been asked their views on the detailed plans. In contrast, there have been a couple of rather innocuous looking 'newsletters' distributed by the company merely referring (quite deceptively in my view) to 'revitalisation'. I think that if you asked most people whether they supported a redevelopment doubling the size of the current Metro, the feedback would be overwhelmingly negative.

Having looked at some of the propaganda produced by AMP about the expansion of the Centre, I must

admit it looked like they had done a survey asking 'what you'd like in an ideal shopping centre?' and just pasted in the results into a document explaining what they are planning to do. One example being a vague reference to community facilities that 'could include' a library and childcare services. I understand AMP have also suggested there would be a restaurant precinct open in the evenings. Our local area has plenty of excellent eating options in the suburbs around the Metro and absolutely no need for further replication in this regard.

The problem with the location of the Metro is that it is very poorly serviced by public transport. For this reason any additional people attending to shop would be forced to drive their cars, clogging roads in the area that are already stretched to the limit. AMP's own study identifies a minimum increase of 50%. I dread to think how this increase would further gridlock the surrounding streets. I am perhaps most alarmed by the increase in traffic that would flow from the proposed expansion of the Centre.

I understand Marrickville council unanimously opposes the development to the extent that they are not prepared to sell Smidmore street or to approve a bridge over the road. This should make the proposal quite unworkable. Given the council comprises ALP, Green and Independent (conservative) councilors, surely their strong opposition indicates the local concern present.
