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Direction west - east

- Clear continuation from Bradbury into Airds along Campbellfield Avenue. •
- Clear view across sports fields and dam. ٠
- Clear view of town centre, development facing dam, main (existing) retail building, leisure • buildings and pub.



Direction south - north

- Clear view of petrol station, pub, main (existing) retail building travelling northbound. •
- Clear view of natural bushland areas once passed the town centre. •



Direction east - west

- Clear view of main (existing) retail building and pub upon entering intersection. ٠
- Clear view across sports fields and dam once passed the town centre. •
- Clear continuation from Airds into Bradbury along Campbellfield Avenue. •



Direction north - south

- Clear view of natural bushland areas. •
- Clear view of main (existing) retail building, pub and petrol station travelling southbound. •
