I do not support the submission on practical, environmental and aesthetic grounds. Shire roads, in particular the Woolooware Cronulla and Kurnell peninsula are serviced by 2 roads viz. Captain Cook Drive and the Kingsway (up to Cronulla Beach). A doubling of residences in Woolooware will be disasterous for movement in this part of the Shire. Currently vehicle movements in the shire particularly at peak hour and weekends are significantly slower than has previously been the case due to governments' urban consolidation plans. It should be remembered that the roads in this part of the Shire were laid out some 100 years ago when the population was insignificant compared to today.
