Subject: Response to Lot 1 DP871039 Bayside Way, Brunswick Heads Notification

Thank you for your letter dated 13 September 2011 notifying me of the proposal that involves subdivision of land at Lot 1 DP871039 Bayside Way, Brunswick Heads.

As the owner of the property at Lot 4, DP576360, Bayside Way, Brunswick Heads, I would like to advise you of my concerns, which I outline below, along with requests for information that I hope the developer will be able to provide.

1. Bridge

I want to express my personal concern about the adverse impacts of the proposed drainage easement onto my land. Given that the proposed drainage easement carries along my property, it will divide my land into two parts and bring immediate impact on my amenity and my planned usage. The developer should construct a proper bridge over the water channel easement on my land so that vehicular access to both sides within my property is provided.

2. Access

The proposed new road to be constructed along the southern boundary on the developer's land does not allow for neighbourhood access. Therefore, I would like to request the developer to provide two neighbourhood access roads on each side of the water channel for my future development.

3. Channel Widening

Since the developer intends to construct a 10 metres wide and 2.5 metres deep drainage easement across the northern part of my land to connect the next water channel which flows from west to east on my land, the downstream portion of the west-east channel needs to be widened and deepened proportionally in order to accommodate substantial increase of water flow from their property to my land via the proposed drainage easement. Without widening the downstream of the

west-east channel, my land will be flooded by the additional water discharged from their land. The developer has to be responsible for the widening work.

4. Compensation

The proposed drainage easement will clearly interfere and have adverse impact on my use and enjoyment of my land. Not only will the drainage easement occupy part of my land, it will definitely cause me troubles and inconvenience in the future. A compensation of \$120,000 from the developer is therefore required.

Should the development precede, I request in writing and drawings the arrangements agreed to address all of the requests above.

I look forward to your correspondence and co-operation in due course.
