The proposal is clearly unsuitable for the area on many grounds:

* the proposed height of the buildings clearly breaches local council regulations, and being larger that any other building in the Shire is clearly inappropriate for the site

* the massive development (700 apartments, shopping mall, entertainment venues etc) will cause massive traffic issues in the area. The roads in the area are already unable to cope with present traffic flow and this development would only exacerbate the problems as all estimates talk of over an extra 1000 car movements per hour. No effective traffic proposals have been offered for dealing with the vast increase in traffic flow that would occur. The proposal to park and bus people to the Sharks games is laughable. Traffic regularly banks from the Kingsway to the roundabout on Captain Cook Drive because of inadequate planning (eg witness the refusal of government to widen the Gannons Rd overpass when the duplication of the railway was carried out).
