Gannons Road and Captain Cook Drive are already severely congested at peak times, resulting in lengthy delays on both roads.

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
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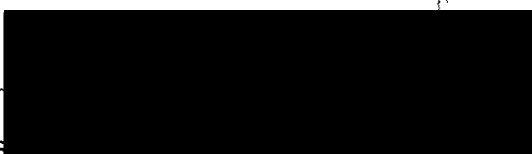
